absolute power

Complete authority to make decisions.

The years after Jesus Christ was born.

castle

A large, strong building with high walls and towers built in the past by a ruler to protect the people inside from attack.

century

A period of 100 years.

chronology

The order in which events happened.

decade

A period of 10 years.

empire

A group of countries that a ruler or government has control over.

feudal system

A hierarchy where people are put into different groups based on their class and roles.

future

A time that has not happened yet.

heir

The person who will inherit the throne on the monarch's death.



hierarchy The order of people or things from most important to least important. invasion When a foreign army enters a country by force. kingdom A country that a king or queen rules. law A rule that states how people may and may not behave in a society. monarch A king or queen who rules a kingdom. monarchy A type of country that has a king or queen as the head of state. palace A large house where a ruler, such as a king or queen, lives with their family. parliament A group of people who make laws for their country. past A period of time before the present. period A length of time. portrait

A painting, drawing or photograph of a person, usually showing their head and shoulders.

present

The time happening now.

reign

The period of time that a king or queen rules over a country.

religion

The belief in and worship of a god or gods.

royal

Connected to a king or queen.

rule

To control a country or empire.

ruler

A person who rules a country or empire.

serf

A peasant at the bottom of the feudal system.

sovereign

A king or queen.

timeline

A line of dates to show the order that events happened through time.

year

12 months, 365 days, or sometimes 366 days, from 1st January to 31st December.
